This Executive Board Meeting was called to discuss the return of students to in-person classes. Victory High School's governing Board has decided to follow the Phoenix Union High School District in continuing remote learning until January 2021.

Dr. Branham and Ms. Jackson, were in attendance, Mrs. Murphy was absent.

Dr. Branham made a motion to continue remote learning until January 2021, Ms. Jackson seconded. A vote was taken and Dr. Branham voted yes; Ms. Jackson voted yes. Motion was passed.

The letter below was sent out to Parents.

Dear Parents and Guardians

September 16, 2020

It is with sorrow that we send out this letter. We were looking forward to seeing all of our students return on October 12, 2020; however Victory will continue remote learning until January 4, 2021.

This decision was not made lightly, the Governing Board looked at both sides of having students returning to in-person classes. The board looked at students decreased academic achievement, and loss of social emotional learning were taken into consideration. The board also looked at the substantial community spread of OVID-19 cases in Victory's community (85041 zip code area). According to both state and county health data this means Victory is in the red zone, and unable to conduct in-person classes at this time. Please see chart below.

Re-opening and Learning Scenarios

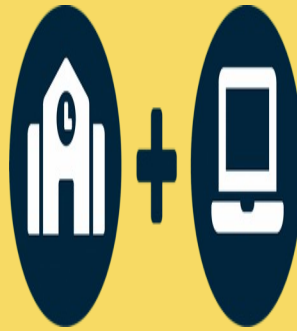


Traditional Learning Scenario 1

All 3 benchmarks in the green category for two consecutive weeks of data.

Minimal community spread:

Evidence of isolated cases or limited community transmission, case investigations underway; no evidence of exposure in large communal setting



Hybrid Learning Scenario 2*

All 3 benchmarks in the "yellow" or "green" categories for two consecutive weeks of data.

Moderate Community

Spread: Sustained transmission with high likelihood or confirmed exposure within communal settings and potential for rapid increase in cases



Virtual w/Onsite Support Learning Scenario 3

One or more benchmarks in the "red" category for two consecutive weeks of data

Substantial community spread: Large scale, controlled community transmission, including communal settings (e.g., schools, workplaces)
